

NOTICE TO CUSTOMERS OF FILING

TRANSMISSION COST RECOVERY RIDER

On February 28, 2025, Montana-Dakota Utilities Co. (Montana-Dakota) filed its application with the South Dakota Public Utilities Commission (Commission) to update its Transmission Cost Recovery Rider (TCRR) rate in accordance with the Company's Transmission Cost Recovery Rider Rate 59 tariff that states the rates will be revised annually to reflect the projected costs to be recovered through the next year.

The proposed TCRR rate includes South Dakota's allocation of transmission related revenues, credits, and expenses assessed by both the Midcontinent Independent System Operator (MISO) and the Southwest Power Pool (SPP) for transmission service not currently recovered through electric service rates and a true-up amount from the current TCRR rate.

Montana-Dakota has requested the proposed TCRR rate effective with service rendered on and after May 1, 2025, subject to Commission review and approval. This change is only being proposed at this time and will not be effective until Commission action has been taken.

Proposed Transmission Cost Recovery Rate: (\$0.00127) per kWh

If approved, a typical residential customer using 900 kWh would see an increase of approximately \$0.80 per month, or \$9.60 annually.

NOTICE TO CUSTOMERS OF FILING

INFRASTRUCTURE RIDER

On February 28, 2025, Montana-Dakota Utilities Co. (Montana-Dakota) filed its application with the South Dakota Public Utilities Commission (Commission) to update its Infrastructure Rider (IR) rate in accordance with the Company's Infrastructure Rider Rate 56 tariff. The tariff states rates will be revised annually to reflect the projected costs to be recovered through the next year.

The proposed IR rate includes South Dakota's allocation of costs related to the closure of three of the Company's power plants and a true-up amount from the current IR rate, along with other select projects benefiting South Dakota customers but are not recovered in base rates.

Montana-Dakota has requested the proposed IR rate effective with service rendered on and after May 1, 2025, subject to Commission review and approval. This change is only being proposed at this time and will not be effective until Commission action has been taken.

Proposed Infrastructure Rate: \$0.00260 per kWh

If approved, a typical residential customer using 900 kWh would see an approximate decrease of \$1.20 per month, or \$14.40 annually.
